Grads Receive 24 Scholarships

Senior Pres., Jim Pearce, Awarded William Woodward Medal of Honor

Today the Woodward Medal of Honor was awarded to Jim Pearce for outstanding school citizenship and leadership. This is only the fourth time that the medal has been awarded; the second time to a graduating senior.

Richard Hataway, Class of 1958, Edgar Freidlander, Class of 1895, and Winton Moeller, Class of 1922, were former recipients of the medal.

The William Woodward Medal of Honor is the highest honor that the faculty may confer upon a graduating senior. Candidates for this honor are nominated in writing by individual faculty members, and the decision to confer the honor is the responsibility of the Woodward High School Awards Committee, consisting of nine faculty members appointed by the principal.

To be eligible for nomination for this honor a student must be outstanding and should have demonstrated high qualities of integrity, leadership and scholarship. Respect for the rights of others and success in meeting obligations should have been characteristic of this person's high school career.

The William Woodward Medal came into existence in 1958 largely through the efforts of a number of faculty members including Mr. Winton Moeller, late principal of the school. Both boys and girls are eligible for the award, and more than one award may be conferred in one year.

Jim has executed his obligations for this award by membership in Woodward Ensemble, Hi-Y, and team participation in football and basketball. Jim has also served as president of the Junior and Senior Classes.
